

- ✓ To promote seminars and workshops on genealogical research and methodology and such other studies as may seem helpful to the members.
- ✓ To provide a centre and suitable meeting place for various activities of the Society and its members by rent or purchase or otherwise.
- ✓ To encourage the establishment of Branches of the Society under such terms and conditions as the Bylaws of the Society may from time to time provide.
- ✓ To achieve the foregoing objects, funds may be raised and donations, gifts, legacies and bequests accepted.

- Active since 1973
- Serving **984 members** through eleven branches around the province
- Contributing over **30,000 volunteer hours** reported in 2012
- Mailing and exchanging our quarterly journal *Relatively Speaking* to over 50 libraries and Societies
- Running 20 plus branch and 'special interest group' (SIG) meetings monthly
- Receiving **3065 visitors** to the library in 2012
- Holding an **annual genealogical conference** or similar event for members and the general public
- Contributing to the growing database of names of those buried in Alberta cemeteries and photographing gravestones to preserve their appearance for future generations. (Note: Alberta has 1566 active (registered) cemeteries. Our volunteers have recorded over 2000 because some cemeteries are no longer in service. Over 710,000 names have been recorded and several branches are also photographing cemeteries & headstones.)

- Responding to **689 research queries** in 2012
- Reviewing our Society's **Operations Manual**, reorganizing and updating the contents for Officers, Directors and Committee Chairs and producing a **Treasurer's Handbook** for branch treasurers

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

President

At the May 2012 Board of Directors meeting, I accepted the position of President. The past seven months have been eventful as well as challenging and rewarding.

The September retreat was held at the Providence Renewal Centre. Topics included Sharing of Personal Genealogical Finds, Evolving Branch Roles in the Digital Age of Research, and a Team Building workshop. The retreat was well attended. Susan Haga and Maxine Maxwell did a great job in organizing this two-day event.

In September, a committee was formed for promoting genealogy to youth. The program material is being developed by John Althouse, Lianne Kruger and Marion Rex.

The position of Library & Research has been vacant since February 2011. I am pleased that the position has been filled by Claudine Nelson. Claudine previously held the position of Library Director for the Edmonton branch. Her experience in this position will benefit AGS.

The AGS and Edmonton Branch libraries will be appraised in February 2013. The last appraisal was completed in April 2006. The appraisal is necessary to determine if the current insurance coverage is adequate.

The Operations Manual was completed in December 2009 with a recommendation that a review and updates occur every three to five years. A committee was formed to complete the review and updates. The committee consists of Mary Ann Legris, Sandra Vaneldik, Jo Nuthack and Linda Winski.

During the month of October 2012, Lynn Carrier resigned her position as Treasurer. Wayne

Harker graciously volunteered to fill the responsibilities of Treasurer for November, December and January 2013. Wayne coordinated the audit of the society's financials with Kouri, Berezan, Heinrichs, Chartered Accountants. Wayne has been instrumental in getting us back on track as we continue our search for a candidate to fill this position.

The November Board of Directors meeting was held using Webinar technology. Lianne Kruger, President of the Red Deer branch, was instrumental in helping with this technology. She provided a mini training session for the participants prior to the meeting. In 2013 we will again use this technology during the winter months to reduce travel and expense.

The Website Renewal Project is being developed by Lyn Meehan and Carey Kennedy. Lyn provided a brief overview of the project at the September retreat. In addition to the website project Lyn will be redesigning the brochure.

The position of Historian has been vacant for a number of years. To commemorate our 40th anniversary John Althouse, Past President of Edmonton Branch, has graciously taken on the task of updating the society's history from 1998 to 2012. To complete this task he will consolidate the branch histories into a book publication.

AGS will be celebrating its 40th anniversary at the 2013 conference on April 20-21, 2013. I look forward to visiting with you at this event.

I was very sad to lose Lynn Carrier who left the position of AGS Treasurer in October. She had given us a business view of our organisation that had been lacking, especially reviewing every expense with a view to reducing it and/or improving the return that we get from it. She was also of great help in improving our Chart of Accounts. Special thanks go to Wayne Harker who stepped in when approached from October through year-end and has done a stellar job. We are looking forward to working with Susan McKeen who has been appointed as AGS Treasurer for 2013.

Highlights of 2012

- o Following the audit last April, a letter from the Accountants suggested that the finance policies and procedures should be reviewed, especially those dealing with expenses incurred by officers and committees. They also made suggestions for several new policies such as 'Security checks for the Treasurers'. This has been completed
- Work was started on the Chart of Accounts and ways in which the branch treasurers could be assisted in the development of budgets. This was interrupted with the departure of Lynn, but I will push to have this work completed this year.

- We reviewed and approved budgets for continued work on the Master Surname and Cemetery databases.
- Our society needs to move into the 21st century in the way we approach the rest of the world and a well-presented and easily-used website is the way to go. When we were approached for seed money for the development of a website, we approved the expense.
- The Policies & Procedures Committee worked hard this year to revamp the Policies and Procedures Manual, moving all financial information into one section and, at the same time, creating a Handbook for Treasurers.
- The lease for our AGS office and AGS & Edmonton Branch Library was renewed under favourable terms.
- The contents of the AGS and Edmonton Branch Libraries were appraised for insurance purposes.

The year 2012 was a very successful year in that we made positive changes to the ways in which we operate based on the auditor's suggestions, worked on an improved Chart of Accounts which will facilitate better financial management, implemented better budgeting for large projects, and revamped the policies and procedures. We are moving toward making committees and projects financially responsible: budgets for website, research, membership, Conference/GenFair, library, policies & procedures, and Relatively Speaking were reviewed and incorporated into the 2013 budget.

The year of 2012 was ushered in with the skirl of the pipes rather than a bang as we co-hosted with the Friends of the Public Library a Robbie Burns Night held at the Royal Canadian Legion. It was well attended and a successful fund-raiser.

Programs:

The programs in 2012 were diverse and informative.

<u>January:</u> A very informative power–point on Heraldry in ancient times: granting, displaying, describing and recording coats of arms, family crests, shields and rules of Heraldry.

<u>February:</u> Jan Beecher a journalist for the Brooks Bulletin newspaper caught our interest with a power–point on her recommendations, expertise and experience in writing, be it for one's own memoirs, family history, or writing for genealogy magazines.

March: "Black Sheep Ancestry" had members sharing stories about their black sheep ancestors. It was not a surprise that everyone had a black sheep ancestor for whom they are still searching. April: "Destination Canada" A Genealogical Guide to Immigration records by Dave Obee. A partial overview was given on the content, focusing on European and British Atlantic ports and Canadian ports of arrival, and Canadian/ US Border Crossings.

The executive remained largely unchanged except for changes in 2 positions: Deanna Bullock succeeded Marilyn Wales as Vice President and Joyce Willard assumed the position of Secretary, previously held by Barbara Blackley. The position of Chair of the Recording and Indexing Committee was left vacant. During the course of the term, Deanna Bullock, our Vice President moved from the Edmonton area so the Branch finished the year with that position vacant. A voluntary position of Branch Volunteer Coordinator was developed and Jeneane Roberts accepted the role.

The biggest item addressed during the year was the lease. While this was addressed by the AGS Board, there was a good deal of discussion with our Branch prior to the renewal. Our lease has been renewed at this site for five more years. About the same time, there was a revision of the parking policy at the site. In a discussion with the landlord, our unique situation was indicated and adaptations to the method were made which to this point have generally worked very well.

Genealogical education continued at Edmonton Branch. The "Tracing Your Family Tree" Course continued to be the benchmark for genealogical education in the Edmonton area, but it also had its ups and downs. The Spring Course did not fill and was cancelled. But following coverage through the media, the Autumn Course not only filled with 21 students but produced a waiting list. This term, a number of new instructors presented sessions in the course under the capable direction of Margaret McInall. In addition, a committee of the Branch developed a plan for the delivery of a genealogy course at the University of Alberta through the ELLA program. That program has been approved, and the committee is making the final preparations to deliver it this Spring.

The Branch has also provided opportunities for members to share what they know, build their skills, and add to their knowledge. This is done in large part through our Special Interest Groups (SIG). Edmonton Branch currently has England Wales, Ireland, Scotland, German, Ukrainian, Canada USA, Compugene (PC computer genealogy), and Postscripts (writing of family history) SIG. Regretfully, the Mac Reunion SIG (Apple computer genealogy) has ceased to operate as no one stepped forward to assume its leadership. A few of the SIG have offered special events. The Irish SIG was part of a St. Patrick's Day Event at the Library and presented a day long workshop on Internet Sources for Irish genealogy. Postscripts did a morning of "Story Smithing" where members, in small groups, could bring pieces of their personal family history writing to share and receive editing suggestions. The German group spent a social evening at the Oktoberfest at the German Canadian Club.

Under the capable hand of Margaret Bendickson, Edmonton Branch has provided presentations and activities of general interest to our members at monthly meetings. A series of short presentations on the military relatives of members, presentations by authors, and a modified "pecha kucha" presentation were among the highlights of these programs.

Edmonton Branch has advocated for causes of benefit to its members and perhaps many genealogists. As a Branch, we provided a letter to the Minister voicing our concerns on the proposed cuts to service and funding to LAC. We also encouraged our members to forward individual letters related to this important matter. We also sent a letter of support for the request of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress that the government funding for the church properties indexing project (which includes the recording of cemeteries) be continued. At a general meeting, we received a presentation from the Canadian History Museum and were asked how they might become relevant to us. We are currently advocating in relation to Alberta Vital Records to encourage greater ease of access and reduced costs of these records..

Over the past year, we continued to make Edmonton Branch better known in the Edmonton area and in our fellow AGS Branches. To do this, we have engaged in a number of "outreach" activities. These have been in the form of static displays, presentations, and workshops. The events which the Branch participated in this year were St. Albert Retired Teachers (January 26), Second Winds (April 18), Peace River (May 12), Strathcona County (June 7), Heritage Week / Open Doors (July 3-8), Fort Edmonton Park (August 12), Justice Canada (September 19), Leduc Public Library (October 3), and Covenant Health Group (November 10). In addition, I travelled to Peace River in May where I gave a one-day workshop on Eastern European genealogy, and Les Campbell and I are developing a one-day workshop on genealogical topics on the USA for presentation in Drayton Valley in March 2013. Other events have been booked or are being studied for future "outreach" events. For "Heritage Week / Open Doors", we continued to have the Library available free of charge to anyone who might have an interest in genealogy and wish to experience doing genealogy during regular hours, but the Branch also added three presentations for evenings and weekend afternoons. At the Fort Edmonton event, we were provided with the theme of the day which was "Women" so not only provided a display to promote AGS but also catered the

display to that theme providing a static display entitled "The Ladies of Fort Edmonton Park ~ Finding Our Female Lines." For this and future static displays, Louise Perkins worked to put together a promotional portable bulletin board. We are currently out of Branch brochures but have delayed printing off large numbers of new ones as we wait to see the new AGS brochure and perhaps develop one having a similar look.

The biggest boon to the Branch came in the form of an extensive article (3 pages) which appeared in the Edmonton Journal on July 14, 2012. The article involved interviews with AGS members and information from members of the Branch executive. This really enhanced our profile. The TYFT course which had not filled in the Spring Session of 2012 was filled for the Autumn Session within two weeks after the article appeared in the newspaper. It also produced visits to our library and phone calls from those interested in learning more.

Members of Edmonton Branch continue to do yeoman service as volunteers. This work can be readily seen when one visits the Library. Our research team not only provides answers to many genealogical queries but also has generated a good amount of revenue in the process. In addition, members are involved in several AGS positions and roles which also are needed to carry on what we do as a Branch and AGS does as a society. Finally, other members work jointly with other organizations such as the PAA on projects which are invaluable to all genealogists. This year, we have been active contributors to "News from the Branches" in *Relatively* Speaking. To aid in distribution, members have stepped forward to fill in vacancies in the group who prepare our magazine for mailing. We thank all those volunteers for their tireless and most dedicated work.

Our Library volunteers continue to be the face of our organization. They have been involved in a number of activities in addition to the stocking and operating of the Library. These volunteers had a bee to clean out the storage area at the back of our Library. They also were major participants in the St. Patrick's Day event mentioned earlier.

Our Library Committee in concert with the AGS Library Director is discussing matters related to procedures for operating the Library. The Library collection has been almost been completely transferred into a digital format and discussions are taking place to determine exactly how this digital record will be made available.

A number of matters related to the overall operation of the Branch and the building have taken place this year. We are in good financial shape, and our Treasurer Bonita Couper has ably navigated the new accounting procedures which have come on stream. Our policy and procedures binders were purged, updated, and redistributed in current form through the efforts of member volunteers. We purchase a new computer monitor, a printer, and a microwave oven to replace ones that had "died". Wayne Harker is currently looking for reasonably priced replacements for some of our chairs which constantly require repair. He also was called upon to purchase and replace the handle and lock assembly for the washroom door to replace one which no longer would lock securely.

At the end of 2012, we had 564 members consisting of 500 memberships. The last two years have seen the Branch membership increase, reversing the decline in members for several years prior. This year, the Branch formally presented certificates for 25 years of AGS membership to Rheanne Smith at her home and Marion and Howard Sim at our May 2012 Branch Meeting.

We are on the eve of the 40th Anniversary of the Alberta Genealogical Society. Edmonton members are looking forward to this milestone. Some members are involved in projects marking this occasion such as the writing and compiling of an AGS history for the last fifteen years, the planning and execution of the AGS conference, development of an educational genealogical resource for school age children, placing the pre-1905 vital records in a form which will be more readily accessible, and many other excellent projects, soon to be made public. Edmonton Branch members continue to do stellar volunteer work from which not only our Branch but all

genealogists benefit. The Annual General Meeting for 2013 will be held on 28 February 2013 shortly after this report is submitted. A new executive will be elected and / or selected at that meeting.

- We established executive email addresses that can be passed on from year to year, thus keeping AGS business out of personal email.
- Patricia Greber set up a Facebook page for our branch.

PROJECTS:

Communications

February 2012

An appeal was drafted to all AGS Members in a two-page summary concerning LAC's (Library and Archives Canada) continuing modernization and how their new mandate will affect all researchers in the future. The summary was emailed as a PDF to some, and sent as a Supplement (insert) in the May 2012 *Relatively Speaking* issue. There was an update at the meeting about some new decisions made by LAC effective in Feb 2013, and ways we could get further involved.

Mar Apr 2012: New AGS Brochure and website redesign

The AGS brochure was overhauled and unveiled at the meeting for critiquing. Some discussion

went on in February about re-skinning the AGS website. Review of aesthetics, organization of information, navigation, material content, bringing the website up-to-date and implementing a Content Manager System (CMS) was talked about. Some wireframes will be shown; design process and budgeting will be discussed.

April 2012: Red Deer's GenFair advertisement

The half-page advertisement to the right was submitted by AGS Communications in March for publication in GenFair's booklet advertising the society's 40th anniversary, April 2013. The cost was \$200. Initially the advert was to be placed on page 14, however somewhere between proofing and the booklet's publication, the announcement shifted to the back page. Good for us!

September 2012: *Relatively Speaking* indexing project:

By late September all issues of *Relatively* Speaking (Fall 1973-Aug 2012) were scanned and keyword searchable in PDF format. All articles were index, with only one issue left — November 2012. Building the subject index and fine tuning author and title indexes, then formatting the tables still is the most laborious task and was underway. Jo Nuthack's 1984 compilation What's In Relatively Speaking? A Comprehensive Index, Volumes 1 to 10 was a PDF to be included in the published DVD. Despite technology, to date, better than 400 hours have been donated to the project, along with \$800 in equipment use and software. I can't imagine the hours Jo placed in his project with 1983 4 historical technology. Thanks Jo for a great foundation! Please remember, the development of this 40-year index is only an author, title and subject index.

November 2012: Edmonton Branch-AGS letter voicing concern over LAC responsibilities.

Accolades to John Althouse for writing a letter to the federal government regarding the cutbacks and restructuring of LAC; and the future of Canada's documentary heritage.

"Library and Archives Canada (LAC), the federal institution responsible for preserving Canada's history and cultural heritage, is under threat. Badly conceived restructuring, a redefinition of its mandate, and financial cutbacks are undermining LAC's ability to acquire, preserve and make publicly available Canada's full documentary heritage"

December 2012: AGS website:

Since the November 2012 AGS Board meeting, Carey Kennedy (Webmaster) and Lyn Meehan (Communications) have teamed up and are rolling out a new streamlined design for the entire AGS site. The two have brought the freshest ideas with flexible technology to the prototype. A one-hour demo and talk will be provided at the 2 March 2013 Board meeting regarding the new features to emerge throughout 2013.

Late December *Relatively Speaking* indexing project halted to place more energy into website and brochure development.

Grants/Fundraising 2012

AHRF Sponsorship

In 2012, AGS received \$35,000 in sponsorship funding from Alberta Historical Resources Foundation (AHRF) funded by the Alberta Lottery Fund. The Sponsorship received from AHRF is applied to expenses incurred for our publications, genealogical training programs and workshops, business meetings and general administration.

Community Spirit Program Grant

We received \$1,764.75 from the Community Spirit Program Grant. We also applied for the next grant in the amount of \$4,709 based on donations received in the 2011 fiscal year. Since that time, Community Spirit Program Grant funding has been eliminated from the 2013 Government of Alberta budget.

Casino

The Alberta Genealogical Society did not work a casino in the 2012 year; \$31,215.98 was deferred from the casino in the 3rd quarter (September

Library

AGS was without a library director until I was appointed in September 2012.

The AGS library and Edmonton Branch library were in the process of being catalogued with new bar codes, by a team of Edmonton Branch volunteers. Win Sebelius was instrumental in the purchasing of (in 2011) and learning how to use the library cataloguing computer program "Resource Mate Plus 3", a Database Management System. At the end of December the team had almost completed the bar coding process of all books (end of December, about 4,000 barcodes on books and the borrowing cards = about 8,000 stickums). Once all bar codes are on the books, the library holdings should be ready to be uploaded for searching online.

We continue to acquire as many Local History books as we can – a resource heavily used in the library by patrons and Research Services.

'Relatively Speaking" has been traded for many years with Societies from Canada and around the world. Needing more library shelf space and knowing that members are not reading many of the Newsletters or Society Periodicals, I made the decision to notify 39, Branches and Societies, that we would no longer be exchanging publications for a saving of about \$1,000.00. The Branches do purchase Periodicals that they want for their library. I did assist the Policy and Procedures Committee to update the Library Chair job description which was approved in November.

Master Surname Database

We have had some issues and delays in getting the database online this year due to technical, medical and or personal matters, on both my and the database technician's part. Correspondence and phone calls with OtherMachines have been encouraging yet the task is taking longer than originally anticipated.

The AGS Master Surname database continues to grow, with people contacting us from all over

Alberta, other provinces and countries, submitting transcriptions. The Alberta Genealogical Society Master Surname Database is, as always, a valuable research resource and aids in preserving information for many generations to come.

Policy & Procedures

Following the audit of 2012, the legal advisors for the Society recommended the development of additional policies and procedures within the financial section of the Operations Manual. The Manual was completed in December of 2009 and included committee guidelines for a "five year or more frequent review as necessary". During the May Board Meeting, the committee was reactivated to initiate a review. The committee members appointed: Mary Ann Legris, Executive Officer responsible for Policies & Procedures: Jo Nuthack, Parliamentarian: Sandra Vaneldik, Past President and Linda Winski, Office Coordinator were members of the committee responsible for the development of the Operations Manual; Lynn Carrier, Treasurer; and Les Campbell, President, ex officio member.

The committee met in June and, over the summer months, prepared ten financial policies and procedures that were approved at the September Retreat Board meeting. During the Retreat, the committee met with the Branch Presidents to review the *Operations Manual*. Many suggestions were received aimed mostly at making the Manual more 'user-friendly'. Two suggestions stood out: 1) placing all of the finance material into one section and 2) creating a separate *Handbook for Treasurers* which would contain all of the finance material plus information regarding budgeting and bookkeeping specifics.

Once all the finance policies and procedures were placed into one section of the Manual, it became apparent to the committee that a reorganization of the Manual as a whole was necessary. Over the Fall months nine more procedures were written or amended and approved by the Board, and the reorganization began. Lynn Carrier assisted with the finance material until the time of her resignation. The Manual reorganization has taken place and the Handbook for Treasurers has been completed. The revised Operations Manual will be a part of the Orientation for New Presidents planned for the March 2013 Board Meeting. The Branches will have several months to use the Manual and Handbook before the September Retreat when another review session will be held with the Branch Presidents.

We continued, as always, to strive for balance in selected articles with the hope that readers will glean some tidbits from the experiences our authors so interestingly chronicle that will help them with their own research. We have been heartened with the connections made by readers from some of these articles and the feedback we, as a group, continue to receive.

We have been most appreciative of the continued support from contributors, both AGS members and non-members alike. We are also very appreciative of the volunteers who stepped forward to replace Shirley Machan and Pat Pettitt so that Spinning Webs and Gleanings could continue. Denise Daubert now prepares Spinning Webs, and Hal and Lesley O'Neil now prepare Gleanings. Other changes to our committee this year included Peter Williams moving to the west coast; however he has assured us he will continue to contribute material to us for publication.

Early in the year we put our collective heads together to come up with useful replacements for the library segment that we realized would not continue. We hit upon a "Visiting Alberta's Past" and "From the Branches" segments which we hope will succeed and grow. To that end we published an article on the Leduc Grain Elevator, structures that are fast becoming things of the past, and the historic St. Margaret's Church in Deville. A commentary from Fort McMurray on their flood, the lessons learned and how to avoid a recurrence provided good warning to all branches; and Edmonton Branch president John

Althouse listed some new initiatives that Edmonton Branch is undertaking. With each of these new segments we hope to receive input from the branches that reflect the uniqueness of their locale and events that might prove helpful to others.

We extend our thanks all our committee members along with the regular feature contributors for their ongoing efforts. We also wish to acknowledge the strong support we receive from the AGS Board, without which the quality of *Relatively Speaking* would be diminished.

As in previous years we did submit one our 2011 *Relatively Speaking* issues to the FFHS Elizabeth Simpson Award. Unfortunately we did not place in any of their criteria and the Overseas Category, that we were fortunate to win in 2008, was not included in their listing. We did not receive any feedback from their judging committee on any category changes or the performance of the entries which was disappointing. Our purpose for entering this competition is primarily to receive positive critiquing to assist us in the continuing improvement of *Relatively Speaking*. We will submit an entry in 2013 and make mention of our wish for improved dialogue.

Research Services

The **Research Services Committee** for both AGS and Edmonton Branch began meeting each Friday at the AGS Library in 1999 and has continued to do so since that year.

Participating during 2012 were Phil Bentley, Gordon Berdahl, Shannon Cherkowski, Gail Cockwill, Natalie Edwards, John Hazelwood, Shirley Machan, Carol Martyniuk, Claudine Nelson, Pat Pettitt, Jeneane Roberts, Win Sebelius and Norma Wolowyk. Although not an official member of the Research Committee Peter Skitsko gave invaluable assistance on queries relating to Eastern Europe, his expertise has solved many a language and name spelling challenge during 2012.

Each week committee members selected queries, did research in the AGS library and at other local institutions, and responded by e-mail from their own home or by mailing correspondence. A query database was compiled of surnames researched, submitter's name, locality of inquiry and the ID number assigned to each query. Sheila Majeau maintained this query database on computer during 2012 and also processed credit card payments.

Charges billed were fifty cents per page of photocopying and two dollars per page of computer printout from the AGS Master Databank. Also, clients were encouraged to send additional monies to the Society in appreciation of the volunteer commitment given to their queries. These funds ranged from a few dollars to \$1500 in 2012.

Besides using the resources of the Society's library, committee members used resources at Provincial Archives of Alberta, the Legislature Library, University of Alberta Library, Edmonton Public Library, City of Edmonton Archives, etc. to thoroughly research a query. They also accessed family history information, on behalf of clients, through their own subscriptions to paid genealogical sites. 346 queries were received by AGS during 2012. As Edmonton Branch AGS received 343, the total queries handled by the Committee was 689 during the year, this was 17 queries more than in 2011. The majority of queries arrived by email through links on the AGS Website and Edmonton Branch Website.

Most of the queries received related to specific families, with the others generally relating to Society membership, how to obtain vital statistics certificates, recommended genealogical software, cemetery information, how to research, etc. Using the online AGS Homestead Databases we were able to assist families applying for the Alberta Century Farm and Ranch Award by

providing copies of census and homestead records. Copies of land records were charged at \$10 plus 50 cents per page of copy, with the average file six to twelve pages.

About 50% of initial requests arrived because the client had found a reference on the land files or local history book databases on the AGS website. In about 90% of these cases research progressed to burial records, local history books, newspaper articles, vital records information, etc.

The Alberta Genealogical Society is very fortunate to have such a wonderful group of dedicated researchers. Their commitment to taking up the research challenge and thus providing family history information to people from around the world received many expressions of appreciation from clients during 2012. The Committee celebrated an appreciation lunch funded by Edmonton Branch AGS in early December.

Thank you to Linda Winski, AGS Office Coordinator, for handling the mail for the Research Committee and collecting credit card payment information. Her prompt attention to informing Research Committee members that payment has arrived is very much appreciated.
