In 2004, retiring farmer Orval Sorkin had a dream... and Sorkenville was born. For years, he had been farming around the remnants of an old homestead just begging to be restored, so when he got out of actively

farming, he bought the place and 'retired'. Betty, his life partner, hadn't seen this coming, but wasn't too surprised, rolled up her sleeves and signed



on. So began a labor of love: moving, tearing apart, relocating and restoring old buildings of local historical significance on a central site.
