Births, Marriages & Deaths as extracted from the Grande Prairie Herald Tribune Newspaper. Continued from the Fall 2019/Winter 2020 issue of "Heritage Seekers"

May 20, 1932 (Friday) Issue:

- "Hythe News: Mrs. J.N. RASMUSSEN, age 40, passed away last Sunday. Born August 24, 1883 at Cambria, Minnesota and came with her husband to Canada twelve years ago and settled in the Hythe District where she resided until her death. Leaves to mourn her loss, a husband and four sons: Tremaine, Lewis, James and Thomas all residing at Hythe. The remains were shipped to Lake Crystal, Minnesota...."

 - o "Born to Mr. and Mrs. Gus **HENDERSON** May 14th, a son."
 - o "Born to Mr. and Mrs. **MEYER** May 14th a son."

- "Flying Shot Lake News: Mrs. HENDERSON passed away at age 95 Sunday. Born in the Parish of Tovarin, Aberdeenshire, Scotland in 1837. Left Scotland 46 years ago with her husband to join sons in Oak Lake, Manitoba.... Mr. HENDERSON predeceased her 41 years ago, also two infant children in Scotland..... Survived by six children: William and Thomas of Edmonton, Mrs. J.R.
 HATCH of Birtie Lake, Minnesota, Mrs. R. MITCHELL and Mrs. T. WATERMAN of the Flying Shot District..... Mrs. HENDERSON was the daughter of the late Alex CHRISTIE of Tornvin, Aberdeenshire, Scotland..... Funeral at the home of Mrs. R. MITCHELL May 17th and interred in the Flying Shot Cemetery...."

May 27, 1932 Issue:

- "Goodfare News: Born to Mr. and Mrs. Arthur BARRE, May 18, a girl."

June 7, 1932 Issue:

- No births, marriages or deaths found.

June 7, 1932 Issue:

- "Funeral of Mrs. E. **BLANES** of North Kleskun..... Died May 28 at the Grande Prairie Hospital. Leaves a husband and nine children and a sister Mrs. **SORKENS**.... Service at the little Lutheran

Chapel at the North Kleskun District.... Interment at the adjoining church yard by Rev. E.H. **NI-BEN**, the church Pastor, conducted the service."

"Glen Leslie News: Born to Mr. and Mrs. O. MINARD, son."


June 14, 1932 (Tues) Issue:

Research: 2019 Volunteer Researcher Report

2019 was a busy year of researching. A total of 38 queries were received, all of which I replied to, racking up 87 volunteer hours. Twelve of those queries required obtaining obituaries from the microfilm of the old Grande Prairie newspapers, several were replying to general questions and/or related information, one looking for five news items regarding marriages and then an unusual request asking for the date and time of their "live" birth.

Other queries replied to were:

- Providing information on how to find Homestead Records.
- Another was looking for help with Austria research which Al Bromling provided.
- One DNA query was replied to with the help of Debbie Was of the Edmonton Branch, previously of the Grande Prairie Branch. I learned from helping with that query, all those who get their DNA done should be prepared for the results possibly being a surprize or not what they expected.
- A query for the Morinville, AB area was forwarded to the Edmonton Branch.
- Four queries were looking for grave locations one at the Rosedale Cemetery at Crooked Creek, AB, one at Lake Saskatoon cemetery of two family members, another of the location of a grave at Blueberry Mountain, AB for a family coming from England in August 2019 wanting an obituary and to see the family grave while here. And then a query regarding a burial at the Wanham, AB cemetery. The obituary for that person stated the 1969 burial was at the Wanham Cemetery, but the information of that cemetery on line had no such person listed. The Birch Hills County looks after that cemetery and confirmed there was no one in that cemetery with the surname I was looking for. In doing some further research, I learned that burial had been a cremation and that Grande Prairie did not have a crematorium until 1979. The procedure prior to 1979, when someone was to be cremated, was to have the casket at the funeral and then it was shipped by train to Edmonton for cremation. Following that, the ashes were returned to Grande Prairie. However records at the time did not keep track of who took or picked up the ashes/urn. There may have been intention of those ashes being placed at the Wanham Cemetery, but it did not happen, so then the question remains as to where they may be. Another learned query done.


